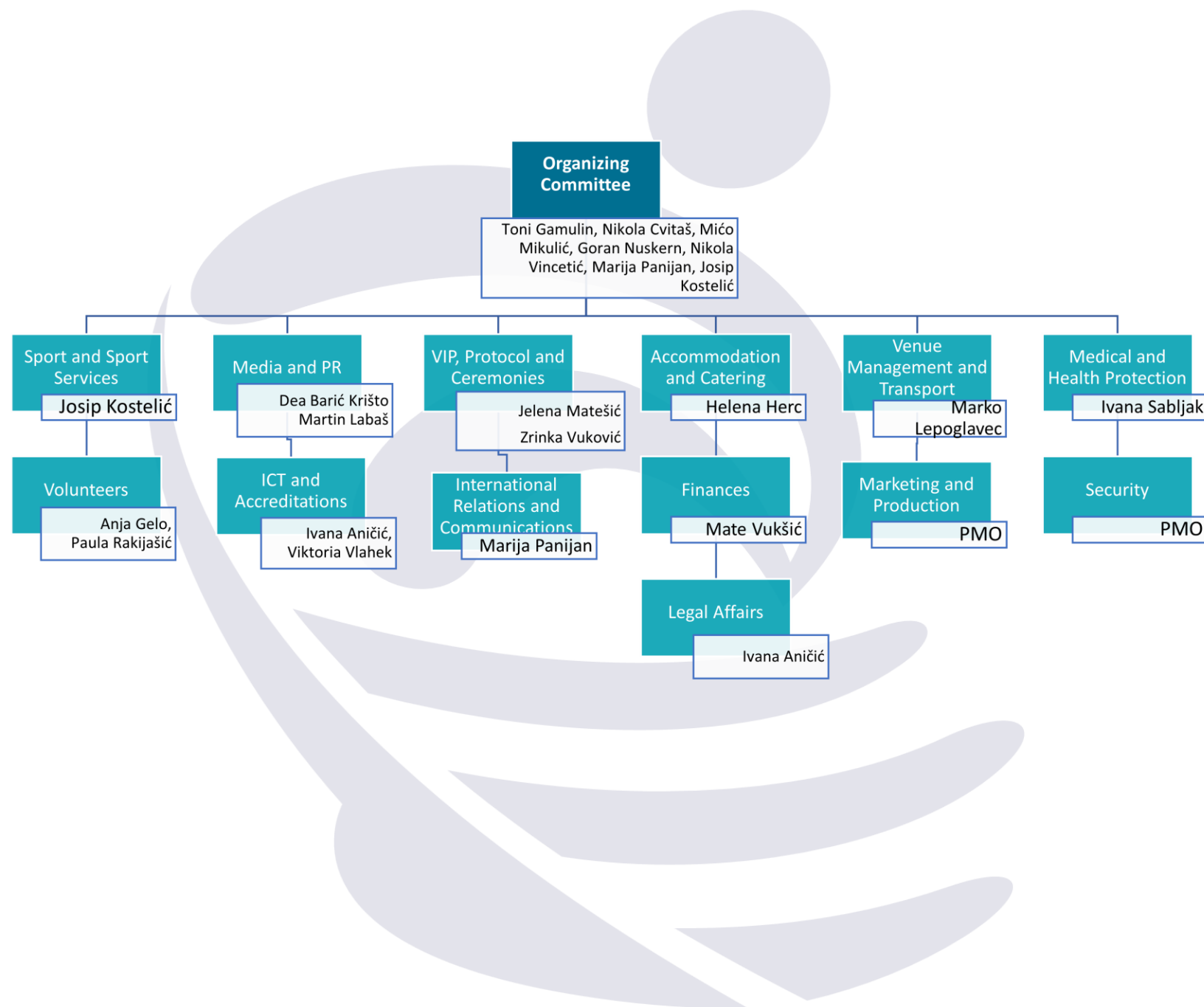

### HOST CITY – ZAGREB

With county status, Zagreb is the administrative, economic, diplomatic and cultural center of the country.

A stroll through Zagreb is an interesting and pleasant trip through history and the present. The longest Zagreb street, Ilica; divides the old and romantic Uptown from the younger and always busy Downtown. The oldest parts Gradec and Kaptol, from which Zagreb grew, are ranked among the most beautiful preserved secession centers in Europe.

Zagreb is a city of science and culture. From spring to autumn many open-air plays and exhibitions are held, and are a real attraction for visitors, ensuring a special atmosphere in the city. Here too are other attractions like the lively outdoor market, one of the last in Europe, which is an absolutely first class experience for all those who come to Zagreb.

For some, the most recognisable part of Zagreb is the neo-Gothic Zagreb Cathedral situated on the Kaptol square. Others will mostly take away memories of the always lively central square Trg bana Josipa Jelačića.



Zagreb is also the stage for many cultural and other international events. A city filled with a young population is predestined to also be an exceptionally sports orientated city with many sports facilities, including European and World champions medal winners in many sports.

### CROATIAN ACADEMIC SPORTS FEDERATION

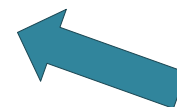

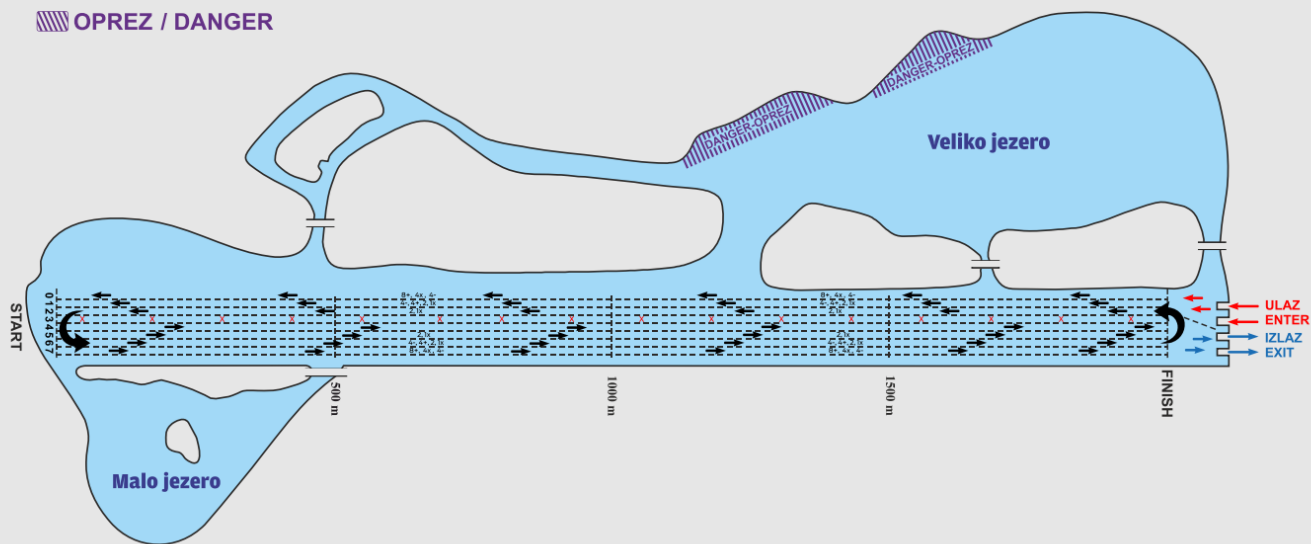

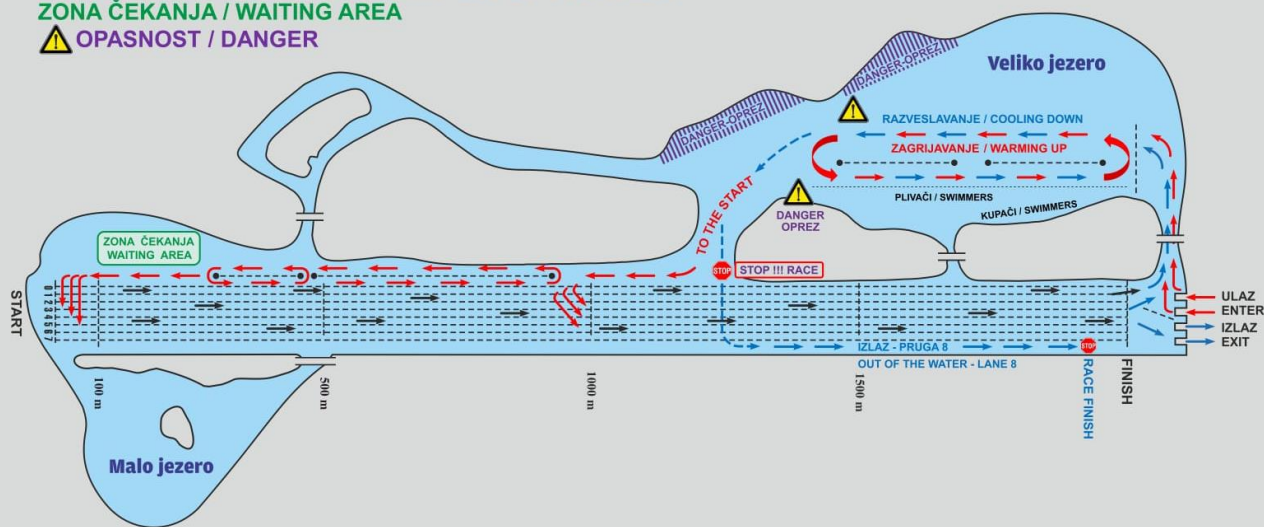

## SPORT INFO

### General Technical Meeting

General Technical Meeting will be held next to the accommodation site, at the **Faculty of Kinesiology**, on Wednesday, 28th August afternoon at 08:00 PM.

The presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory.

### TEAM TOURNAMENTS

Men: LM1x, M1x, LM2x, M2x, LM2-, M2-, LM4-, M4-, M4x, M8+

Women: LW1x, W1x, W2-, LW2x, W2x, W4-, W4x, W8+

Mixed: W/M4x (The team is composed of 2 men and 2 women from the same university)

- Women may compete as the coxswain in Men's crews and vice versa.
- Where no lightweight competition exists, medals may be awarded to lightweight crews competing in open competitions.
- Crews may double-enter at their own risk with regard to the schedule of racing.
- In the event of a double entry, a withdrawal from one of the entries after the GTM will automatically result in the withdrawal of the second entry, except for medically documented reasons officially recorded by the OC doctor

## BOAT RENTALS

### RULES OF RENTING BOATS DURING ZAGREB 2024 EUC ROWING

There is the possibility of renting rowing boats (with a set of oars) for the duration of the championship. All information and the submission form can be found here:

The demand for boat rental should be submitted by **August 19, 2024**.

The boats need to be collected after the accreditation. The person while collecting the boats should pay 100 EUR deposit per boat (in cash) and sign the rules and regulations of the boat rental.

#### BOAT RENTAL PROCEDURE

1. Only those boats will be rented which have been previously reserved and the rental fee and deposit will be paid.
2. Boat rental will take place on Tuesday, August 27, from 9 AM.
3. Please check the technical condition of the rented equipment. Any comments should be reported to the person in charge of the rental. The person responsible for the rental is an experienced rowing coach and during the championships, he will be able to provide the necessary technical assistance.
4. Return of the rented equipment will be held on Saturday, August 31, from 7 PM. The borrowed equipment must be returned in the same condition it was rented and only in this case the deposit will be returned.
5. Rented boats are the starting boats which are normally used by the rowers of our region. The organizers have made every effort to ensure that rented equipment is in the best quality possible. However, not in every case it has been possible to meet all the requests of the ordering parties (e.g., regarding the boat displacement).

## ACCOMMODATION

### ATHLETES VILLAGE “STJEPAN RADIĆ”

Accommodation for participants will be in the **Students’ Residence Hall “Stjepan Radić”**, at the address of Jarunska cesta 2 in Zagreb, Croatia. The village encompasses 12 pavilions and one central building, which houses the restaurants and a number of other services.

The accreditation centre is within the Athletes Village. Once you’ve received your accreditation, you’ll need to proceed to the reception to check-in and receive the key to your room. The working hours will be 0-24. Aside from checking in and out, you can also leave your keys there while you’re away from the dormitories.

**On your day of departure, you’re required to check-out by 10.00, when only breakfast will be served.**



### ACCOMMODATION for Athletes and Team Officials

#### Rooms - Athletes

During your stay in Zagreb you will be accommodated in double rooms. Rooms for athletes were renovated seven years ago, but air conditioning is not available. There are electric outlets, but we advise you against trying to bring a mobile air-conditioning unit into a room even if you have one – the electrical grid might not be able to cope with the demands. It was designed with only a few small items in mind – computers, hair dryers, refrigerators.

Bed linens and towels will be provided and ready when you check into your rooms and changed once during your stay.

In pavilions where athletes will be accommodated, bathrooms are joint ones, with each floor having one complete with toilets and showers.

### **Rooms – Team Officials**

During your stay in Zagreb you will be accommodated in single rooms. Air conditioning is not available. There are electric outlets, but we advise you against trying to bring a mobile air-conditioning unit into a room even if you have one – the electrical grid might not be able to cope with the demands. It was designed with only a few small items in mind – computers, hair dryers, refrigerators.

Bed linens and towels will be provided and ready when you check into your rooms and changed once during your stay.

In pavillions where officials will be accommodated, bathrooms are joint ones, with each floor having one complete with toilets and showers.

### **ACCOMMODATION for Referees**

Referees will be accommodated in Hotel Diplomat (address: Horvatova ul. 35B, 10020, Zagreb, Novi Zagreb).



### **SAFETY AND MEDICAL SERVICES**

The OC provides medical service for all participants of the event and it will be available throughout the Championship.

The medical room within Athletes Village will be operational all hours of the day (0-24), in case of emergency. A medical team led by a doctor and a fully-equipped ambulance vehicle will be on-site at Jarun Lake to provide immediate medical assistance during competition days.

The head of delegation are kindly asked to inform the OC about athletes who suffer from chronic diseases such as diabetes, heart problems etc. and any allergy to drugs that are life-threatening.

Please note that you are responsible for your own health insurance.

## CATERING

During training and competition days, inside the Student Village there will be two restaurants operating for breakfast. The lunch and dinner will be served on Jarun Lake, near the competition venue, except for the day of arrival when lunch and dinner will be served within the Student Village.

**The catering service in the Student Village can only be used with the presence of accreditation and a meal card.** A meal card will be given to each participant along with the room keys. The meal card is scanned at the cash register. If the participant does not have a meal card, he will have to pay for the meal according to the price list. Meal cards can only be scanned once for each meal. Additionally, each participant can order items outside of the one-meal offer at their own expense. Such items are paid for at the cash desk, exclusively in cash. Payment by card is not possible, and there are two ATMs outside the restaurant, in the village. The prices of the items will be marked on the notice board in the restaurant.

**The catering service at Jarun lake (lunch and dinner) can only be used with the presence of accreditation and a meal coupon.** Meal coupons will be given to each head of delegation at GTM. Head of delegation should distribute the coupons to the participants. Upon arrival for lunch and dinner, it will be necessary to hand over the



coupon to the volunteer in charge. Without a coupon, participants will not be able to receive meals.

Food is not allowed to be carried outside of the restaurant for health and safety reasons.

One meal for LUNCH includes:

- One dessert/fruit

One meal for DINNER includes:

## ADDITIONAL SERVICE WITHIN ATHLETES VILLAGE

- **Laundry service**

Located on the ground floor of Pavilion 12. You can deliver clothes for washing from 14:00 – 22:00. The service will be charged accordingly (detergent and drying included).

- **Gym**

The gym is located in Pavilion 11, on the north side of the building. The gym is free for use by all participants, both athletes and officials. Working hours: 08:00 – 20:00. To use a gym free of charge, you must bring your accreditation.

- **Info Point**

If you have any questions or uncertainties, feel free to come to the Info point and get the appropriate information. There will be one Info Point in the Athletes' Village and other at the Jarun Lake. Info mail is available on the backside of your accreditation.

- **Medical room**

The medical room will be operational all hours of the day (0-24), in case of emergency. Please note that you are responsible for your own health insurance.

- **Grocery store and news-stand**

These facilities are operated by the Students' Centre and that means that all services provided by those facilities are charged accordingly.

The grocery store sells the usual assortment of goods. The store typically works from 07:00 – 21:00, from Monday to Saturday.

## ACCREDITATION PROCESS

Accreditation center is at the same place as the Athletes Village.

Accreditation Center working hours (27.8.2024.): 08:00 – 00:00

### REQUIRED DOCUMENTS for accreditation process:

#### ATHLETES

- Passport or ID card (ORIGINAL, not copy);
- Certificate of Academic Eligibility signed personally by athlete and signed and sealed by the University (**this is IEF itself**)

#### OFFICIALS

- Passport or ID card;
- Certificate of Academic Eligibility signed personally by official (**this is IEF itself**)

#### HEAD OF DELEGATION

- Proof of payment received from the bank

**Head of delegation should be the person who is going to do the accreditation process for entire University, not coach or athletes.** Only one person can go to accreditation centre bringing all the documents.

Please note that data entered in the Quantitative Entry Forms is considered as relevant data for the payments of the Participation fee (payment made to the Organizing Committee) and EUSA Entry Fee (payment made to EUSA).

Amounts due to be paid are calculated based on numbers registered through your quantitative entries, and pro-forma invoices are generated automatically. You can download them from the EUSA system any time by clicking on "View invoice".

Any outstanding fees not paid by bank transfer will have to be made in cash at the time of registration.

### **Partial accreditation of teams is not possible!**

Accreditation is done for the **entire sports team** from a particular university. The accreditation process is carried out by the head of the delegation or another person authorized by the registered university.

**The accreditation process will be carried out in five steps.**

1. In the first step, the head of the delegation will determine the composition of the delegation that arrived in Zagreb.
2. In the second step, all financial obligations will be checked. Performance is possible only in case of fully executed and approved payments in the system, and the head of the delegation will immediately receive the original invoice for all payments.
3. In the third step, the rooming list is created. Rooming lists will be prepared in advance according to completed applications in Individual entry forms in accordance with EUSA rules. Male athletes will be in male pavilions, female athletes in female pavilions in double rooms, while officials will be in their pavilions in single rooms.
4. In the fourth step, a check is carried out by EUSA and accreditations are issued.
5. In the fifth, final step, the keys are picked up at the reception. The keys can only be picked up with the presentation of the accreditation and the rooming list, which you will receive in the third step.

**ACCREDITATION CARD**

The Accreditation Card is the only official and valid document for Rowing 2024 participants; therefore, it must always be clearly visible in order to access restricted event areas.

Monitoring of access will be achieved through the Accreditation Cards, which will be checked at all site entrances. Depending on their category, each participant will be allowed to access a certain zone. People not holding an Accreditation Card or holding a Card that does not have the required access rights will not be allowed to enter. Improper usage of personal Accreditation Cards is prosecutable by law and will be reported to the Security Operational Center.

**LOSS OF THE ACCREDITATION CARD**

In case of loss of the Accreditation Card, the participant must personally approach the OC Accreditation Center and report the loss by using a valid Identification document (passport or ID card). Inquiries about issuing replacement cards are to be made directly at the Accreditation Center, where new cards will be printed. Issuing of a new accreditation card will be charged by the OC (50 EUR)



## Opening Ceremony Information

Opening Ceremony will take place on Thursday, 29th August 2024 at 7:00 pm (to be confirmed) at Jarun Lake. All participating competitors and officials are invited to attend the Ceremony. The Ceremony will last for about 45 minutes.

For participating in the Opening Ceremony, each participating NUSA is kindly requested to appoint one competitor as flag bearer who will take part in the march-past during the Ceremony. Upon arrival at the starting point, they will be given information about the Ceremony and given instructions on how to proceed.

After the Opening Ceremony, the Organizing Committee has planned a party for you in the Roko Club, which is close to Athlete's Village „Stjepan Radić“ .

The Organizing Committee highly appreciates the participation and collaboration of all competitors and officials, making these ceremonies memorable events for all involved.

- During previously set official days of EUC Rowing - Zagreb 2024 with arrival (August 27th) and departure day (September 1st), transportation service will be organized by OC. It will fully cover routes from/to official (arrival/departure) points likewise from/to accommodation.
- Transportation from/to other arrival/departure points that are not listed above will not be organized nor covered by Rowing 2024 organization.
- Official point (for both arrival, and departure) will have at least one representative from Rowing 2024 organization.
- Every possible and unpredicted change in approved Travel plan(s) shall be transmitted via email directly to the Transportation Department:

### Local Transportation

- For all students and volunteers accommodation is provided at the same location (Athletes Village) → the main transportation hub.
- Jarun Lake is located in a radius of 4 kilometres from the Athletes Village.
- Location of the entrance/exit bus stops (to Jarun Lake) is next to Athletes Village.
- All buses are low floor buses, air-conditioned and fulfil all demands for Rowing 2024 participants, with total minimum of required 75 passenger positions.

- Buses will be labelled for better recognition and for better visual communication with participants and for easy distinction among regular ones.
- Parking slots are next to Athletes Village and within village (with limited space) and are provided free of charge for all guest and team members coming with personal buses/vans/cars.

Transportation services from/to official welcome points and from/to Jarun Lake during official competition days will be provided free of charge for all participants.

Form of transportation which will be used during EUC depends on the target group of participants, frequency and duration of the journey, taking into account the flexibility and types of the means of transportation.
